ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The Juris Doctor (JD) program consists of 90 units earned over a three-year (full-time) or four-year (part-time) period. The State Bar of California permits Trinity Law School JD students to earn the entire accredited degree either online, on-campus, or a combination of the two.



WHAT WOULD MY SCHEDULE LOOK LIKE?

The majority of online Juris Doctor coursework is completed independently by the student. Live sessions via video conferencing are required at specific times. Live sessions ensure that information studied independently is sufficiently comprehended. Law school is demanding, and regular live guidance throughout the JD degree is necessary for future Bar exam success. There will be approximately 8 live sessions per semester, per class.
